
We are honored to have these organizations partner with us in our journey to expand out programs to more girls in our communities.

Our 2018-19 Results

What a year it was! We maintained our scholarship rate at about 50% of girls on full scholarships, increased the number of scholarships we provided, expanded into a new community--Niles, hired two new PT staff to assist with our expansion efforts, expanded our Board, and expanded our After School Programs to include 3rd graders. We also hosted over 78 After School Programs and had over 2,200 program participants in our five programs. To top it off, we had 384 high school leaders assist with our programs to showcase their leadership skills and serve as mentors to the 3rd-8th grade girls in our programs.




Program Participant Demographics vs. Evanston Demographics
